Prayer Group.

I have a strong feeling that I was destined to be part of The Nehemiah Project.

I met John Patience at a farewell gathering for Mgr Roger Reader in January and not long after this, he invited me to the house in Streatham, introduced me to the 'family', I shared with him my holistic approach, and my experience of running a prayer group at Coldingley prison. The men really value the prayer group, as it's the one time in the week when they can share how they're really feeling, and trust that God will take care of it all. I've watched them grow in confidence and begin to believe that they're really loved by God, no matter what they've done. . Together with Isobel (one of my chaplaincy volunteers at Coldingley), we agreed to run a weekly prayer group at Nehemiah. We listen to music, share our joys and sorrows and pray together. We also encourage the men to engage with a local church - it's so important to connect with other people of faith, as we can all support each other on our journey. My hope for the future is that all those who commit to the recovery programme at TNP will embrace the opportunity to develop a lasting relationship with God, and come to experience the deep peace that only He

I've recently been reading a book called 'Flourishing' by Maureen Gaffney, and it has really brought home the need for us to focus on how the men we work with at Nehemiah have opportunities to flourish. Gaffney in her book explores the psychological research into the factors which enable people to overcome adversity, maximise potential and enjoy life and ultimately 'flourish'. Two of our former Residents recently came back to tell us how their lives are flourishing. One had gone to his niece's baby shower which shocked his family to see how transformed he had become and the other has rebuilt his relationships with his children and grandchildren which is giving him so much joy.









"I have had 35 years of drinking solidly, no stopping nothing to slow me down. After working for 20 odd years as a chef at a merchant bank still drinking, I lost my job. It was then that I needed to change my life. A friend told me about Nehemiah, so I tried to detox myself before I came, which they told me afterwards was dangerous - I didn't realise! Anyway I came to Nehemiah and I started to get into it. At first it was hard and then it changed. I started to get my children back, I've got three children 32, 21 and a 5-year-old. Now I've got all my children back, I've got my grandchildren back and I owe Nehemiah a lot for that as I wouldn't have got them back my way. I'm here at the end of my journey now, because in a few months I'm looking to move on. The whole of my life I will look back and think I wish I came to Nehemiah earlier. The staff, even when I had my low stages were there to help bring me back up for that I will always be grateful. For all the new men here, you can do it and you can get all of your people back but you've just got to be patient".
